<b>Assessment Details:</b>			
To be successful students will need to be able to:			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Write in full sentences and paragraphs.</li> <li>● Use a range of sources to find out about the topic being studied.</li> <li>● Make inferences from simple sources and back them up with evidence.</li> <li>● Evaluate the information about who, when, where and why a source was produced (provenance) to help work out how reliable and useful it is to answer a particular question. This is a challenging skill that will be developed throughout a student's time studying History at The Cottesloe School.</li> <li>● Read a statement and use their knowledge of the topic to explain whether they agree with it or not and back up their opinion with reasons.</li> </ul>			
<b>What can I do to support my child at home?</b>			
Show an interest in what they are studying. Your child will always have their exercise book unless it has been taken in for marking. Ask to see it. Ask them their opinion about the topic they have been studying. Check your child's homework and remind them to complete tasks. Where possible, please read through their homework to check that they have completed it properly. Encourage your child to watch appropriate history programmes or read either factual history books or fictional ones set during the period being studied. Are there any historic places you could visit locally or further afield? Could you take them to a museum? To discuss the news with your child. History has many connections with political issues and it is helpful if students understand what a democracy is, how Britain elects people to Parliament and what the Prime Minister does.
